6. You cannot do a kindness too soon, for you never know how soon it will be too late. Ralph Waldo Emerson.


7. Things turn out for the best for the people who make the best of the way things turn out. John Wooden, Coach.

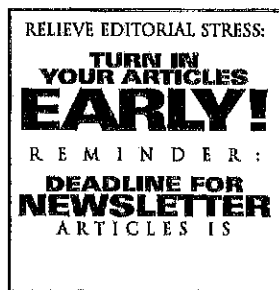

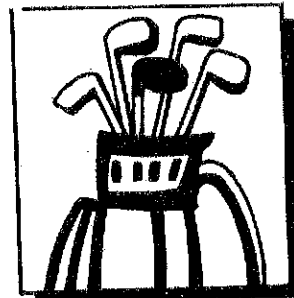

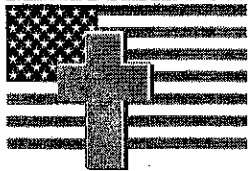

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

18 April 2012

Your Council met Wednesday, April 18, 2012. Highlights include:

Scouts reported that they helped to move books for the Adamstown Library book sale. They are planning a deep sea fishing trip.

Love, Inc. committee reported that the new Homes of Hope house is going well. We have a mother with two daughters currently residing there. They will be in the home for 4-6 months and have already been setting and meeting their goals set by the organizations that are working with them.

Welcome committee reported that they mailed 70 cards this month. Also, they came across a great deal on children's clothing at K-Mart and purchased over 550 items for only \$1200. They will be holding onto this clothing to be given out at Christmas to our assigned families.

Helping Hands committee reported that they made \$274 on their Ham & Bean soup sale and \$781 on the Holy Week breakfasts. The money will be used toward the cost of the dumpster.

Finance committee asked that you fill in the amount of your offering on the front of your envelope to insure the proper recording of your offering. Due to the sensitivity of this information, please feel free to place your envelope face down in the collection plate. If you are designating your money go to a specific item like Love, Inc. or the Building Fund please make a notation in the memo line of the check so it can be recorded in the proper account.

Property committee reported that they will be laying out the new flower beds, doing weed treatment and edging in the next several weeks. The annual weeding and mulching will take place on Monday, June 4 at 6:00pm. Everyone is invited to come out and help. They will be tinting the windows in Judy's office to cut down on the extreme glare in her desk area. They would also like to recognize Bobby Hershey upon his retirement from the property committee and for all he has done behind the scenes from plowing to weed spraying.

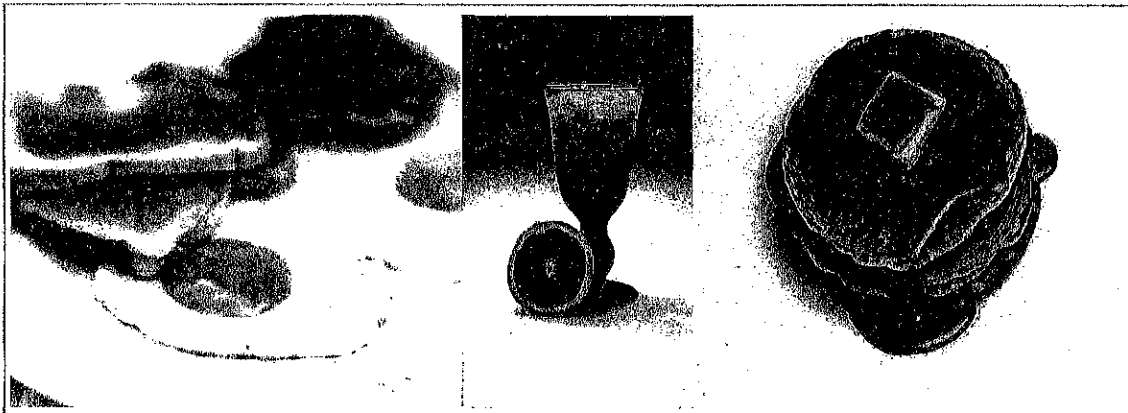

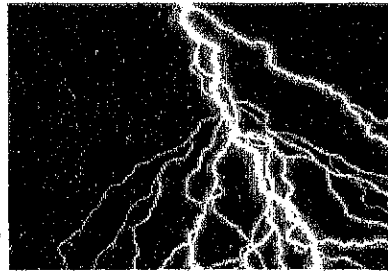

Show your love for your mother, grandmother or aunt this Mother's Day by placing words of appreciation throughout the house for her to find.

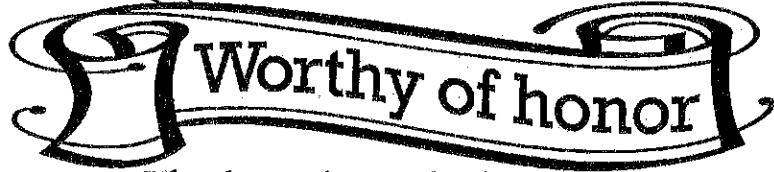
What you need:

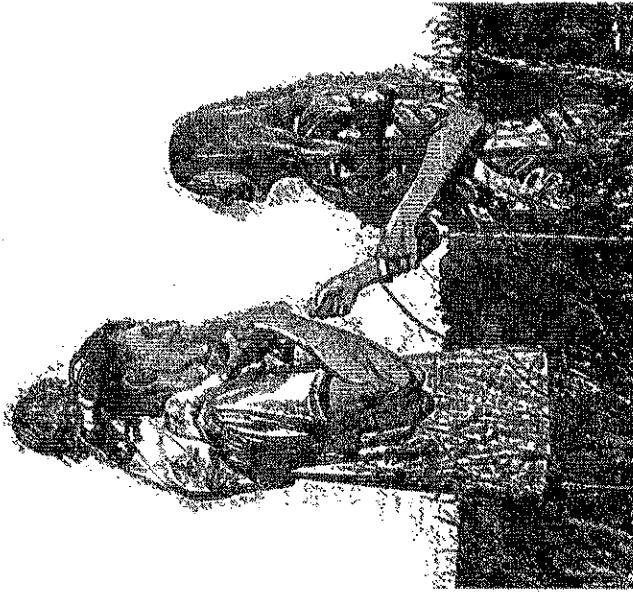
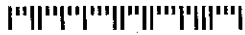
