Age 29, wherever you go, the world's worst drivers are going there too.

Age 39, if your children feel safe, wanted and loved, you are a successful parent.

Age 46, children and grandparents are natural allies.

Age 48, there's no elevator to success;; you have to take the stairs.

Age 54, you can't hug your kids too much.

Age 61, you can inherit wealth but never wisdom.

Age 76, the best sleeping pill is a clear conscience.

Age 81, even when you have pains, you don't have to be one.

Age 88, the days may be long, but life is short.

Could Solomon have said it any better?

But not all our days are predetermined as Brown describes. Sometimes our learning comes from unscheduled appointments known only to God.

Like many others who graduated in the lower half of their classes, Luther resisted standard education, or learning by rote. He was driven by a suspicious nature causing him to question the status quo and ask "why" of prevailing reasoning. He was the moth and the Church's teaching was the flame.

As the world's biggest underdog, Luther openly challenged the most powerful force of his time.

And as he nailed his ninety-five theses to the Castle Church door in Wittenberg, he added a sticky note inviting opponents to debate him. And because of these debates, Western Civilization was soon turned its ear. The end result was a showdown with the baddest dudes in Christendom.

An official indictment was served in the city of Worms to confront this theological renegade. When asked if he would renounce his inflammatory statements about the pope and the church, Luther answered with resilient boldness

Unless I am convicted by Scripture and plain reason—I do not accept the authority of popes and council for they have contradicted each other—my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand. I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Luther was 38 years old when he made that statement.

In fact, at what point in life does truth begin to matter more than compromise and principle more than popularity? At what age do we cloak ourselves in fearlessness? When did John the Baptist dismiss his fear of the king, or Daniel his fear of lions, or Paul his fear of death? Moses was 80 years old when his phobia of pharaohs finally ended.

Fuel for thought for all of us.

May the peace that transcends time and place be with you.

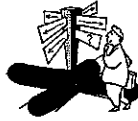

## COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

March 19, 2013

Your Council met Tuesday, March 19, 2013. Highlights include:

**Service committee** reported that the pig stomach dinner is scheduled for Saturday, May 4. The proceeds of the dinner will go toward the disaster relief trip to Minot. The shelving has been completed and the floor painted in the Paul's Porch food storage area. As of this date, 4 seniors have been approved and 4 are pending completion of some paperwork. Dave Kupp has posted the program criteria on the bulletin boards at both doors, so if anyone knows someone who would fit the criteria, please see him so we can sign them up. We have 30 meals available each month. The Relay for Life monthly can collection held the last Saturday of each month will be coming back to Swamp. Dave Kupp has joined Sue Kittler on this project.

**Love, Inc.** reported that the family has moved out of the home as of February 23<sup>rd</sup>. They have found affordable housing and both parents have been employed. The 1 year lease of the Homes of Hope home is up and the steering committee is looking to extend it.

**Welcome committee** reported that they mailed 71 cards this month. The prayer shawl ministry is sending shawls along with the disaster group to Minot and will be delivering them to our shut-ins. The Sr. Citizen banquet was a huge success with 74 seniors attending.

**Helping Hands committee** reported that there will be Holy Week breakfasts this coming week beginning at 6:00am.

**Property committee** reported that the playground overhaul is on hold because it may become an Eagle project. A landscaping plan and costs will be presented next month to the committee for their review. We are moving forward with the switch from fuel oil to gas. The committee has received the necessary approvals from both the Township and UGI and is working on getting the neighbors easement approval. Once this process is complete, a contractor will be hired to perform the work.

**Disaster Response committee** reported that 40 people are going on the Minot trip, 4 of whom are from Swamp. They are doing a coffee fundraiser as their last fundraiser for this trip, so if you are interested see Roz Bansner.

**Worship** reminded us that there will on be 2 services on Easter, 6:00am and 8:30am.

**Youth Ministry** reported that they are having a flashlight egg hunt and sleepover March 22-23. They will be holding a movie night on Sunday 4/7 and visiting the Denver Nursing home on 4/21.

**Learning** reported that the annual Sunday School Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday, March 30 at 10:00am for children up to and including grade 4. Eggs can be dropped off Friday evening or early Saturday morning. Heather Weaver and Jessica Zook will be joining the committee replacing Sue Knauer and Jodi Showalter.

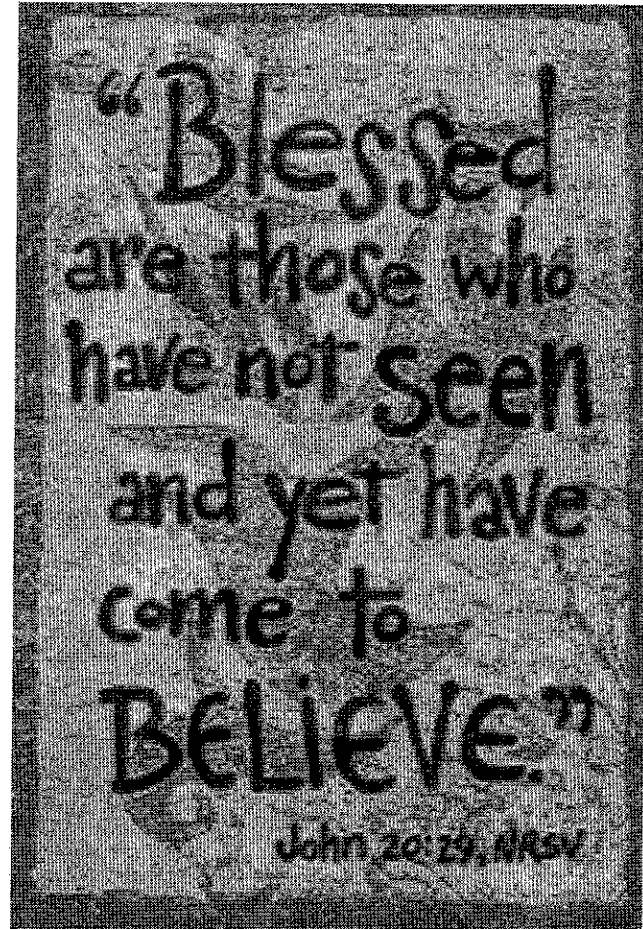
