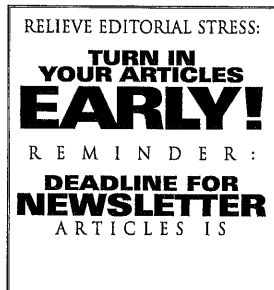

Thanksgiving in Other Lands

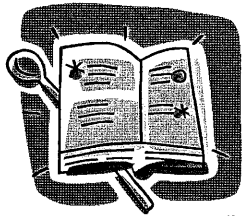

Canada's first Thanksgiving feast, held by English explorer Martin Frobisher, occurred in Newfoundland in 1578. The country's Thanksgiving observance is now on the second Monday in October, with holiday fixings that are similar to those enjoyed by Americans.

In Mexico in 1598, a large group of explorers, soldiers and Franciscans traveled on sand dunes in what's now the American Southwest. They were running low on water, so when they reached the Rio Grande, they expressed gratitude to God by feasting on fish, duck and geese. No official date is set for Thanksgiving celebrations in Mexico.

People of all nationalities have been giving thanks to God for as long as we've been on the earth.

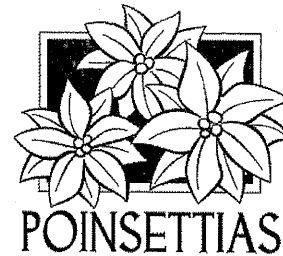

COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

October 2013

Your Council met Wednesday, October 23, 2013. Highlights include:

Scouts reported they are doing their annual food drive again in November. The bags will be dropped off on Saturday, November 9th and pickup up the following Saturday, November 16th.

Service committee reported that the Habitat House build went well and the plans are in place to do it again next year. We have requested 5 families again for Christmas and they will be working with the Welcome Committee to purchase Christmas presents and provide boxes of food for them. Pastor Trout has been using Action Fund money to help people as needed and is taking donations to replenish the fund.

Love, Inc. committee reported that the final tally for the Homes of Hope auction is \$7,139.75. The last family moved out on Saturday 10/19 and we will not be able to take in the next family until we can find two mentors. The mentor job requires only a one day training which the Homes of Hope pays. The interior painting at the new home in Adamstown is not yet finished. If you are willing to help complete this please see Bob Christy.

Welcome committee reported they are in the process of visiting sick in shut-ins. They are also designing Christmas ornaments. They will not be here for this Christmas, but stay tuned for more details. They provided a get a way for Randy and Pam Leisey. And they are in the process of sending out the fall gifts to our college students. If you are a college student or know one of our college students, please contact Judy Habecker to update their address information.

Helping Hands committee served meals at the funerals of Vernon Showalter and Robert Moyer and prepared the food for the Habitat build.

Stewardship committee reported that we are \$15,000 ahead of our income projections for the year however, reminded us that still leaves us \$20,000 short of our spending guidelines.

Worship committee reported that this year's Night of Music will be held on December 15. John Frantz, Bonnie Oplinger, Connie Taylor, Guy Templin and Michael Wargo have been trained and installed as Communion Extenders and will be visiting our sick and shut-ins.

Youth Group reported that the CALM 5 Halloween Party is scheduled for October 27th at 5:00pm and they currently have 120 people signed up. The youth will be starting at 12:00/12:30 to setup. Future activities that are planned are Laser Tag, a Thanksgiving meal for a needy family, a welcome basket for the next Homes of Hope family, and hospitality baskets for the sick and shut-ins at Christmas.

Learning committee reported that the Malaria Campaign is underway and periodic information will be in the bulletin and newsletter. The new Sunday School program with the combined singing and craft is a big hit. Planning for Vacation Bible School is underway. This year we are hosting and the theme is H2O, Soaking in the Spirit. The Sunday School Christmas program planning is in full swing and more details will follow. Hospitality baskets will be made 12/8.

Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on December 8th immediately following the church service. **Please note there will be only one service (8:30) that day.** Also, following the congregational meeting will be hanging of the greens. Lunch will be provided for those that stay to help.
